Well Pet Consent Form

There is an inherent risk during any anesthetic or surgical procedure. Complications can range from mild to life threatening including rarely, death. We normally provide a number of services, described below, intended to reduce these risks. These are not available for a clinic surgery. The low cost spay/neuter clinic is intended to provide an affordable alternative for our clients and reduce pet overpopulation. Although anesthetic and surgical risks cannot be quantified, they are increased in the clinic setting. Please be assured we will still provide the best care and comfort to your pet. Our staff will be happy to discuss with you any questions or concerns you may have.

As you have been made aware all patients must be current on their Rabies vaccination. It is also important for cats to be protected from feline distemper and upper respiratory diseases and dogs from distemper, parvo virus and infectious bronchitis. Dogs with heartworms are at increased anesthetic risk as are dogs and cats with intestinal parasites. The vaccinations and tests can be provided at an additional cost at the Well Pet Clinic and should be done prior to admission. When this is not possible they can be done on the same day but same day vaccination does not necessarily protect the pet that day. Intestinal parasites or heartworms are not always detected by current testing methods when present.

All cats must be in a carrier when they enter and leave the hospital.

I hereby authorize the staff of Chatham Animal Hospital to perform a clinic neuter/spay on my cat or dog.

By choosing the clinic surgery....

I DECLINE MONITORING EQUIPMENT including a cardiac monitor, respiratory monitor, blood pressure monitor and pulse oximeter.

I DECLINE A PREANESTHETIC PROFILE and EKG, which could reduce the risks of anesthesia by detecting liver and kidney problems as well as heart problems.

I DECLINE INTRAVENOUS (IV) FLUIDS. IV Fluids support the organ systems.

An Elizabethan Collar will prevent your pet from traumatizing the incision in most instances. If your pet traumatizes the incision or takes out their stitches, the result could be costly and dangerous. E-Collars can be provided at an added cost. (\$10.00 to \$16.00 for cats, and \$10.00 to \$64.00 for dogs depending on size). If your pet is in heat there will be an extra charge of \$40.00 to \$125.00).
